

### **About CFOFO**

With several political and natural disasters occurring in Fiji around the late 1990s to early 2000s, the Fiji-Canadian community in Greater Vancouver wanted to take action and provide aid to those back in Fiji.

As several Fiji-Canadian organizations were independently attempting to help Fiji's citizens, it became evident that unified community representation was more effective in gaining the attention of governments. A unified approach was not only essential to bolster community strength, but also to enhance credibility to their efforts.

On July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2000, various Fiji-Canadian community leaders from Religious, Cultural, Social, Sporting, Business and Trade sectors came together to participate in a historic community meeting at Fiji Canada Multicultural Centre in Burnaby, BC. It was unanimously agreed to form an umbrella body organization. Thus, prompting the creation of the Canadian Federation of Fiji Organizations (CFOFO).

Although CFOFO was initially formed in response to the crises in Fiji, the organization continued to address issues affecting the Fiji-Canadian community and society at large and became duly registered as per the provisions of the BC Society Act on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2004.

Since then, CFOFO has expanded on its mandate and initiatives. From youth programs to community gatherings, to advocacy work, to fundraising—CFOFO continues to thrive for over the past 2 decades with the support of the community.





CFOFO is a registered non-profit and non-governmental organization (NGO) comprised of Fiji-Canadian organizations from all sectors, including Religious and Cultural, Social and Sporting, Businesses, Trades and Professionals. We act as a unified body representing our various organizations. A few of our aims and objectives include: pooling resources among various organizations and providing aid and assistance to others; recognizing those who provide meritorious and exemplary services to the community; promoting world peace, harmony and democracy; and affiliating with recognized world bodies that represent and advance the interest of our various organizations, Fiji-Canadians and Fiji residents.

### South Asian Youth Mental Health (SAYMH) Ambassador Training

Since December 2019, CFOFO has had the pleasure of partnering up with South Asian Mental Health Alliance and 3E Organization to create a variety of mental health programming and cultural education to local Indo-Fijian and Indo-Caribbean youth over the years. From virtual workshops to outdoor training picnics, the programming has included mental health education, overdose response training, cultural wellness and safety workshops and outreach.













#### **Youth Committee**

CFOFO's Youth Committee is an active body of youth volunteers who organize and assist in various CFOFO events and charitable activities. Our youth volunteers gain a network of positive role models and friends, lots of internal and external opportunities, opportunities to gain various leadership roles, skill development, and professional references.

### **Youth Award Programs**

#### Youth Volunteer Service Awards

Following the discontinuation of the Canadian Federal Government's Canada Day Award Program, CFOFO initiated our own Volunteer Service Award program in April of 2011. CFOFO's Volunteer Service Award was designed to recognize and reinforce the positive contributions of youth to their respective communities and, by extension, for the betterment of Canada. Any youth who has dedicated a minimum of 100 hours towards community service are eligible to apply and receive the award.













### Post-Secondary Educational Scholarship Awards

CFOFO established its post-secondary educational scholarship program in 2004 with the goal of motivating youth to pursue higher education. To-date CFOFO has awarded 50 scholarships, totalling over \$29,500 over the years. This year, we are proud to award another three students with funds to further pursue their post-secondary education!

#### Indo-Fijian Youth Wellness Ambassador Retreat

The once shelved mental health camp project from 2019 was brought back to life and spearheaded by CFOFO's Chairperson, Shannon, with the help of cocoordinator, Shawn Kumar, South Asian Mental Health Alliance (SAMHAA) and 3E Organization (3E). The 3-day and 2-night retreat took place in August of 2023 at a retreat centre in Squamish, BC.

- Art Therapy Activities
- Wellness & Mindfulness Activities
- Team Bonding & Networking

Supported by the BC Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions, the program was entirely free of cost to remain accessible to youth who are truly passionate about mental health education and advocacy work!

#### **Ashsita Gounder**



In 2019, he established the Vancouver Fiji FC Academy Foundation to provide soccer training to youth regardless of gender, race, religion, age, or skill level. The academy started off with three female soccer players and has now grown to 25 male and female players. In July of 2023, Ronald had successfully taken an all Fiji-Canadian Women's Team to play exhibition matches on a Fiji tour. The tour created opportunities for the female players to participate in future tournaments both locally and overseas. His passion for giving back to the soccer community goes hand in hand with his passion for the sport itself.



#### **Vineet Dalton**

Apart from recently joining the CFOFO Executive team, Vineet Dalton has been involved in supporting youth initiatives through the Miss Fiji Canada Organization (MFC) since 2018. 
#### **Jagdish Shankar**

#### Naya Jeevan Church

With a vision to start an Indo-Fijian Church, Chris and Eileen Reddy established Naya Jeevan Church in 1995. Naya Jeevan is the largest Indo-Fijian Church in BC that provides community support such as prayer, counselling, home & hospital visitations, seniors support group and children's ministry. Over the years, Naya Jeevan has partnered with several organizations such as Nightshift Ministries to provide necessities to the underprivileged people in the Whalley area in Surrey, Radio Fiji Mirchi Canada to deliver a one-hour Sunday morning radio program, and WOWS Foundation in Suva, Fiji to provide funds for children's medical treatments and donate household items to families. In June 2024, Naya Jeevan Church fundraised \$10,000 for the development of the Fijian Village Wing at PICS Society in Cloverdale.



#### Sanatan Dharm Cultural Society

Originally known as Sanatan Dharm Ramayan Mandali of Fiji, the Society was officially inaugurated on April 1, 1984. In 2007, the name was changed to Sanatan Dharm Cultural Society (SDCS). Starting off with just a few members who held Ramayan Kathas at various homes before the official formation of the Society, SDCS has grown exponentially to now consist of over 600 members who promote Sanatan Dharm by providing religion, culture, education, and annual festivals to the local community. SDCS was the first religious organization formed by immigrants from Fiji to Canada. The Society's first election was held in 1978 in their newly purchased building at 1795 Napier Street in Vancouver. In 2010, SDCS relocated to 5600 Dorset Street in Burnaby and continues to deliver various religious, cultural, and educational programs. SDCS recently celebrated their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary since formation!

Viti Vibes left a lasting impression on the community as Fijian youth were taking up space in media and also allowing other Fijian youth to share their stories, voices, and opinions to enable learning and critical thinking.
